

A new full-length play based on the profound works of a photographer whose obsession with dissecting linear time and capturing human motion on film lead to the development of cinema. Set in the 1880's in the midst of his elaborate "Animal Locomotion" project, the play is populated by his male and female models - athletes, students, prostitutes, dancers, and the physically abnormal. In the midst of his work he is plagued with the horrific memories of his deceased wife, her infidelity, and the events that lead to his murdering her lover. Studies in Motion explores an important turning point in our culture where our obsession with image begins to usurp our relationship with reason, where context replaces content, and where science and technology are disguised as objective neutrality while in fact serving to mask our darkest passions and emotions. A stylized piece for an ensemble cast about jealousy, madness, and the desire to re-invent one's identity in order to erase the burden of history and memory.
